- Change the curricular
- Overhaul course books or revise reading materials
- Present new examination framework and assessment of school methods

Similarities of Estonian and Azerbaijani Education

- There were fluctuation in the fulfilment of the initial reforms
- Teachers adoptation to reforms went slowly
- Blind acceptance and absence of critical approach towards reforms
- positive aspect characterised for both countries was to try to modernise teaching methods and bring innovation to schools

- Initiatives and discussion of educational reforms in Estonia started in late 1980s
- Legal framework of Estonian educational system is more developed and comprehensive

- •In Azerbaijan beginning of 1990s was characterized with Nagorna-Karabakh war, political instability and economic decline
