


Educationalism

Internationalisation of Azerbaijani HE system

Azerbaijan joined the Bologna process in 2005

Azerbaijan participates in the projects under the Tempus and Erasmus programmes

Findings

Academic, political and economic rationales are appropriate for the internationalisation of Azerbaijani HE system. Academic strategies are implemented through establishing international cooperation and integration into the Bologna system. Poor libraries, centralized education system, low salaries, a lack of access to international journals, modern university facilities and textbooks hinder the internationalisation process are the main challenges in the internationalisation process in post-Soviet Azerbaijan.

Recommendations

- National policy must be established to create appropriate quality assurance systems, increase salaries that strengthen the ability of institutions to compete for foreign researchers and to expand international research cooperation
- ☐ Local HEIs should develop their own internationalisation strategies
